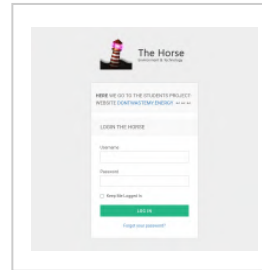

Forming Teams, Planning and Realizing Projects



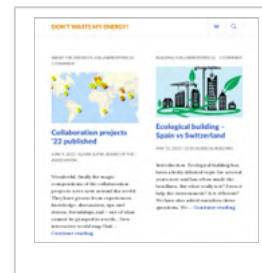
In a password-protected area, teams are formed and project ideas are discussed and collaboratively worked on.

Simple tools support communication across cultural boundaries and are available to teachers and learners.

From imagination to on-site research – 7 steps form the guidelines. Contributions to former projects (> 4,000) are available.



Publishing Projects



Each team receives its own account and independently publishes their contribution on the website dontwastemy.energy.

Teachers and learners gain knowledge of a CMS, text design, copyright, quality standards and web publishing.

Interviews with experts, videos, pictures, surveys, etc. are created, reviewed, refined and published.
